While there is no required format, abstracts must be no more than 300 words and should include the purpose, methods, and results of the project.

By submitting an abstract, the student is agreeing that if it is accepted, they will be present at the entire session to which the presentation is assigned (poster or oral).

<u>Faculty mentor</u> will receive an email notification of the student's conference application. The email will contain a link that faculty must click , allowing the submission to move forward for full consideration. The student's project will not be accepted until their faculty mentor clicks this link and grants approval.

The deadline for the application submission and mentor approval is 11:59pm on April 1<sup>st</sup>, no exceptions. Again, both need to be completed before the deadline. Do not wait until the last minute to submit! Volunteers managing the conference need time to organize the presentations, create a conference program, order t-shirts, create ID tags, organize moderators, etc. This is why submissions will not be accepted after the deadline.

Following the application submission and mentor approval, both the student and faculty will receive a confirmation e-mail message.

The location and time of the presentation will be found in the Conference Program, which will be available on our website (<a href="http://www.salisbury.edu/susrc">http://www.salisbury.edu/susrc</a>) approximately one week before the conference.
